Mark Scheme

This is the scheme according to which we plan to mark the entries, with as yet unspecified weights to each item and possible bonuses to be added. What we ask you to do is fill in a column of the attached Excel sheet with a number in the boxes in accordance with the attached intended solution document and the document you submitted. Thus in the row labelled N1, you should input a number between 0 and 7; if no maximum is specified then input 0 or 1. If you are unsure whether you deserve a mark or not, indicate as much in the comments field. You may also put a reference to your document in that field (e.g. "Codes section Page 6 line 12"). We will (usually) trust you to mark yourselves fairly, and will only check in detail when two teams are close together in the running. But if you are uncertain whether you deserve a mark or not, you can ask us to decide.

Please be careful not otherwise to alter the cells of the spreadsheet!!

Inevitably, you will not have written on your sheets some things which you knew. Bad luck if so. And inevitably you will have found things we have declined to credit. If you feel strongly you deserve credit for something please append details at the end of the spreadsheet.

If teams mark their own, it should greatly accelerate the marking process. If, for whatever reason, you do not wish to mark your entry, please let us know and we'll do it ourselves. ATHMMXIX, as ever, will be there to help.
